I would like to forward a message from Ron Parks, Chairman of the of the Hausman United Communities, regarding today's City of San Antonio City Council meeting at which they are to vote whether to rezone property near the intersection of Hausman and 1604 (in the center of the Edwards Aquifer recharge zone) to allow for big box stores such as a Lowes or a WalMart. HHA strongly opposes rezoning the Edwards Aquifer recharge zone to allow for industries that handle pesticides, herbicides, solvents, and other toxins. This rezoning would also allow for higher density development over the recharge zone. Please make your voice heard to oppose this proposed rezoning.

If you do have concerns, you need to be there regardless of whether the Seale family and the Challenge the Rezone group manage to come to an agreement on covenant restrictions. Zoning and covenant restrictions are two separate and completely different issues.
